ORDER

Since initiating this civil rights action on August 30, 2024, Plaintiff Jason Lynch (“Lynch”) has scattered his allegations across thirteen separate filings. (Docs. 1, 3, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 14, 15, 17, 20, 24, 31). On October 31, 2024, the Court entered an initial screening Order, which noted the deficiencies in Lynch’s first twelve pleadings and allowed him the opportunity to file a *single, superseding* pleading labeled “Third Amended Complaint.” (Doc. 29) (citing *See In re Atlas Lines, Inc.*, 209 F.3d 1064, 1067 (8th Cir. 2000)). That same day, the Clerk’s office received Lynch’s thirteenth pleading—a 55-page document, docketed as a Notice. (Doc. 31).

Lynch could not have received the Court’s October 31 screening Order prior to filing his 55-page Notice. Thus, the Court will not consider the Notice.

Lynch may still correct the deficiencies in his pleadings by filing a “Third Amended Complaint,” on or before **December 3, 2024**. Lynch is reminded that his amended complaint should contain *all Defendants* he seeks to name in this matter, *all claims* he seeks to pursue in this action, and *the factual predicate* for all claims against all Defendants. If

Lynch elects not to file an amended complaint, the Court will screen his original twelve pleadings—the Complaint, Addendums, Amended Complaints, Amicus Brief, and Notice (Docs. 1, 3, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 14, 15, 17, 20, 24).
