ORDER

Service issues remain in this long-pending action. The summons issued for Sergeant Haley Workman at her last-known address has been returned unexecuted with no forwarding address. (Doc. 192). And the three Doe Defendants have yet to be identified. *See* (Doc. 172); (Doc. 200).

As Plaintiff Jason Lynch has previously been notified, it is ultimately his responsibility to provide sufficient information to identify and properly serve each Defendant. (Doc. 4 at 2); (Doc. 81 at 4 n.3) (citing *Lee v. Armontrout*, 991 F.2d 487, 489 (8th Cir. 1993)); (Doc. 172 at 1–2) (same). He has moved for additional time to identify and serve the Doe Defendants. (Doc. 200).

For good cause, the Motion for Extension, (Doc. 200), is granted. Lynch will be provided additional time to identify and serve the Doe Defendants. On the Court's own

motion, the time for serving Defendant Haley Workman is also extended. *See* FED. R. CIV. P. 4(m).

The Court notes that Lynch has been released from incarceration. (Doc. 179). If Lynch still intends that process be served through officers of the Court, *see* 28 U.S.C. § 1915(d), he must file a motion for service containing the information necessary to identify and serve the remaining Defendants. Because the officers must have sufficient time to serve the process, the deadline for any such motion for service will be set prior to the service deadline. If Lynch does not timely file a motion for service, he will be responsible for ensuring the remaining Defendants are properly served before the deadline. **Absent extraordinary circumstances, no further extensions to the service deadline will be granted.**

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. Lynch's Motion for Extension of Time, (Doc. 200), is GRANTED.
2. Any motion for service is due on or before August 31, 2026.
3. For good cause, the time to serve the Doe Defendants and Defendant Haley Workman is extended to October 13, 2026.
4. **If Plaintiff does not timely comply with this Order, his claims against the unserved Defendants will be dismissed without prejudice.** FED. R. CIV. P. 4(m).
