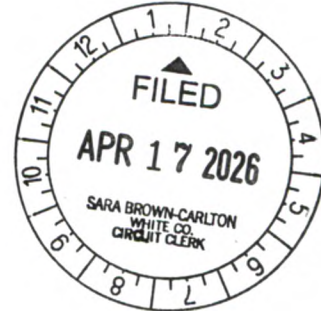

EMERGENCY PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS, PROHIBITION, AND STAY

I. EXTRAORDINARY EMERGENCY JURISDICTION

Petitioner invokes this Court's superintending authority over all lower courts.

This case presents:

Systemic procedural violations

Interference with federal custody

Immediate irreparable harm

II. COMPLETE FAILURE OF CIVIL PROCESS

The White County Circuit Court has:

Bypassed Rule 4 service

Ignored Rule 12 responsive pleadings

Eliminated discovery entirely

Set a trial within ~30 days

Scheduled a "pretrial" 30 minutes before trial

This is not an error it is a total abandonment of lawfully required procedure.

III. "TRIAL BY SURPRISE" IS UNCONSTITUTIONAL

The U.S. Supreme Court and Arkansas courts recognize:

Due process requires notice + opportunity to be heard

Petitioner has neither.

This proceeding is:

Fundamentally unfair

Structurally defective

Constitutionally void

IV. STATE ACTION INTERFERING WITH FEDERAL SENTENCE

The civil writ:

Seeks custody transfer days before federal release

Will cause loss of earned time credits

Extends incarceration beyond federal intent

This violates:

Supremacy Clause

Federal sentencing authority

Protected liberty interests

V. RETALIATION AND DANGER

Petitioner has active federal claims under:

42 U.S.C. § 1981

42 U.S.C. § 1983

42 U.S.C. § 1985

These claims have survived screening.

Returning Petitioner to White County:

Places him back under control of named defendants

Creates substantial risk of retaliation

Chills his constitutional right of access to courts

VI. EXTRAORDINARY FACTORS WARRANTING IMMEDIATE ACTION

Four judicial recusals

Unruled venue motion

Evidence of retaliatory conduct

Imminent federal release

Irreparable harm if writ executed

VII. RELIEF REQUESTED

Petitioner respectfully requests:

1. Immediate stay of all lower court proceedings
2. Writ of Mandamus compelling compliance with civil rules
3. Writ of Prohibition preventing unlawful trial proceedings
4. Order vacating trial setting
5. Order recalling and vacating civil writ
6. Order prohibiting transfer from federal custody
7. Any additional relief necessary to protect constitutional rights

VIII. FINAL STATEMENT

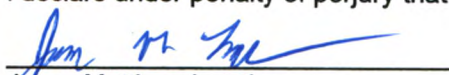
